From the Pastor: Make Room for Life

SPRING has sprung! (but don't let your mainspring get sprung.)

Spring is here – despite the extended snowy season – and it seems like the move from *Easter* to *Springtime* to *Mother's Day* to *End of the school year* and then the *Need to plan out summer* is operating and hyperspeed. (It seems that way to *me*, but I'm betting you may have that truth rushing you along these days too.... Yes?) Life is hurried every day, and days are flying by way too fast.

Our faith can speak to this rush ... but it'll take a p-a-u-s-e for us to hear/listen/do what is not only possible, but also better for us. I'm informed about possible solutions from a book by Pastor Randy Frazee call "Make Room for Life." (Several years back, when my life was simpler, I went to a series of his workshops on the topic.)

Frazee not only has studied Biblical principles of time management, stress reduction and priority setting. He learned it first-hand. He and his wife became parents. He at one point became the teaching pastor of the massive Willow Creek megachurch near Chicago. He became a top author and national-level speaker.

His body then reacted to all of that busyness and stress and over-scheduled chaos: a major health crisis!

Afterwards, with time and reorientation, Randy recovered, and then he discovered how to bring sanity and balance into his life. He shared his personal journey and his discoveries in the book "Making Room for Life." If you are finding yourself hectic or anxious or tired of chasing all that seems required, this new season might just be some time for self-reflection. Here are a few key points.

Bedouin shepherds often live to be 100. Why? Their life is full of purpose and stress-free habits. They work hard and well, but then come home to an evening meal with family and friends. That nightly event stretches multiple hours, with a shared meal, singing, storytelling about today's activities and family history. An extended evening meal, with family and neighbors, is life-giving. (Their meals probably have ingredients which are healthier options than what you and I typically eat.) We can't benefit from their example if we try to squeeze their habits into our too-full schedules. It's a reorientation, and a commitment to do what truly benefits us.

God created us for community, and for abundant life. Rescheduling and reorienting is not just to become even more productive. We could hammer nails into a woodworking project with a golf club, but that totally runs counter to the 3-wood's purpose. If you or I are having trouble – or dissatisfaction – maybe it's because we're using our lives to try something for which we were not designed.

Randy Frazee teaches the concept of the ***Hebrew DayPlanner***. In the time frames which we know from the Bible, the Hebrew day starts at sundown. Our calendars remind us that Jewish holidays always start on evening before that square. Even the Genesis story reverses what we do with time: "...and there was evening and morning, the 2nd/3rd/etc day." Evening first. Daylight comes later. We were created to live in harmony with God's created order, with relationships and sleep and productivity in proper proportions.

If we prioritized our evenings as of first-importance, that would certainly be different than how we are now. So many people dread waking up, then trudge off to work, and find zero energy for much of value after sundown. What would happen if the first project of each bright new day was more about relationship and connection, less about earning a paycheck or getting all the carpooling and shopping done?

Our lifestyle choices affect our children. When our best energies are diverted, it affects our family relationships as well as what our children learn for their futures. Today’s sociologists can easily document that many problems children and teens face are directly related to their overscheduling and inability to just “relax” and “play” and interact with others. The Bedouins’ offspring learn about adult lifestyles from their well-balanced parents. What lessons and patterns are *we* passing along?


It was 2003 when Frazee wrote his book, which by the way carries the subtitle “Trading Chaotic Lifestyles for Connected Relationships.” That was before the exponential growth of the internet and devices and all the technology which grab our attention and sap our energy and attentiveness. Invasive technology has in many ways replaced the 24/7 lifestyle with something that has become approximately 37/9, give or take!

I wonder if disconnecting for certain parts of every day would be among his updated prescriptions for healthy, balanced lives.

I offer these insights with my hope that this does not produce even more pangs of guilt within your soul. In fact, if I was better at “practicing what I preach” (or what Randy Frazee has preached), there would be many more benefits in my own life. Let’s learn together, seek mutual accountability, and find ways to spread grace and contentment. If this whole topic resonates with you, I promise you that you are amid a huge crowd who wish for something better and more fulfilling. Be gentle with yourself. But be ready for not just slight veering from the status quo. This requires a larger transition than that.

One way to start: what if you and I cleared 3/4s of an hour sometime in the week ahead? Watch a video of Frazee telling his story and offering advice from this book [<https://vimeo.com/176775497>]. Let’s see if there are ways to get back into balance, accomplish the truest priorities in life, and be aligned with the delightful lives our Lord intends for us. My signature below is an apt way to close this letter.... and to open new vistas.

Garden of Edin Update

All 40 raised beds in the Garden of Edin Community Garden are rented for the 2018 season! Five of these beds will be gardened exclusively for the Edinboro Food Pantry. This year we will be using a scale to weigh the amount of produce grown and donated. Watch for summer updates as the pounds of produce are harvested! This is our fourth year of sponsoring and welcoming the Edinboro community to garden with us.



Partnerships with community organizations are "blossoming" in the Garden of Edin. Hermitage House Youth Services brings students here for weekly community service hours, watering, mulching, weeding, and learning. The Learn, Earn And Payback students will help us repair raised bed boxes and create new gates to the Meditation Garden. A local Boy Scout, Franklin May is building seating for our Meditation Garden to earn his Eagle Scout award: two large benches for under the Pergola and six smaller seats for inside the Serenity Circle.

This Meditation Garden, located outside the east fence of the Garden of Edin, is open to all, not just gardeners. It will provide shaded, secluded seating, and a water fountain in a setting of quiet, natural beauty. This space fulfills the Garden's mission: to provide a place for "community gathering and sharing, and nourishment for body and spirit." Some landscaping, mulching, and planting are still needed to complete this peaceful, natural space. Workdays are scheduled for Saturdays, April 21 and 28 (weather permitting). Come help the Garden Leadership Team complete this "sacred ground" for our community.
